

## **Questionnaires to be discussed with the short Videos**

These questions are designed to guide the presenter of this video in ministering to the children after the video was presented to them. The idea is to

- test how they have listened,
- re-emphasize important truths to solidify it in their minds and spirits, and
- create a foundation for the Holy Spirit to minister to them through the presenter as the facilitator.

Feel therefore free to make use of this opportunity to speak into the children's lives on the topic the video has highlighted.

**The questions are designed to bring over a pertinent point and it is preferable that you stick closely to them.**

The questionnaires for videos numbers **one through twenty-eight** are separately listed on this webpage under four separate documents entitled:

1. Adam Book with Questions
2. Noah Book with Questions
3. Abraham Book with Questions
4. Jacob Book with Questions

This document contains the questionnaires for videos **twenty-nine through seventy-eight**.

With each questionnaire we have a memory verse that the audience could learn. All the questionnaires for videos 1-28 has the memory verses at the end, but only a few on this document has memory verses. The document entitled **Memory Verse List** on this webpage contains references to the remainder of the memory verses.

## 29. Joseph's Dreams Questions

Genesis 37:1-10, Psalm 25, Matthew 7:6

### Intended Outcome

- If you love the Lord God and are available, He will use you within His plan for your life.
- You should know that He will form you and prepare you for what is coming in your life. You need to be attentive.
- You should be careful not to share what is precious to you with just anybody, especially people who won't understand, for they might turn on you and hurt you.

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

### Questions

1. Q: What was the name of Jacob's wife he loved more than he loved Lea?  
A: (Rachel)
2. Q: What was the name of Rachel's son that Jacob loved more than his other sons?  
A: (Joseph)
3. Q: What did Jacob give Joseph that made his brothers angry?  
A: (A coat of many colours)
4. Q: Joseph dreamed of bunches of grain which he and his brothers had made. What did his brothers' bunches of grain do?  
A: (They bowed before his bunch)

5. Q: He dreamed a second dream where something bowed before him as well. What was it?

A: (The sun, moon and eleven stars)

6. Q: How did his family feel about the dreams?

A: (Angry, annoyed, and jealous)

7. Q: Why did the Lord give Joseph the dreams?

A: (To prepare him for what was coming in his life)

8. Q: What will happen when you live close to the Lord?

A: (He will also prepare you for what is coming in your life)

9. Q: What must you NOT do with things that are precious to you?

A: (Don't tell it to people who won't understand)

10. Q: What may happen if you do tell those people about your special things?

A: (They may laugh at you and say things that may hurt you)

### **Memory Verse:**

**Matthew 7:7:** Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.

and/or

**Psalms 25:4:** Show me your ways, LORD, teach me your paths.

and/or

**Psalms 25:5:** Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Saviour.

### 30. Joseph Sold as a Slave Questions

Genesis 37:12-36, Romans 8:28, Philippians 2:12-13

#### Intended Outcome

- The students will learn that when God has a plan with you, everything may not always go smooth. Sometimes you may go through hard times so you could get where God wants you to be.
- The students will know that the people of God have an enemy, named Satan, who will do everything in his power to get people to desert God. He usually makes things difficult for God's people.
- The students will learn that, if you love the Lord, whatever happens to you, it will always turn out for your good.
- The students will learn that the Lord has rewards waiting for those who obey Him. He rewards you if you joyfully tolerate whatever He allows in your life to develop you.

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

#### Questions:

1. Q: Who can remember what the two dreams, that Joseph dreamed, were about?  
A: Facilitator to prompt as follows, since these are lengthy answers:  
The first one was about...? (*Bunches of grain.*)  
The second was about...? (*The sun, moon, and eleven stars.*)  
And what did they do? (*They bowed before Joseph.*)

2. Q: Jacob sent Joseph to his brothers to hear how they were doing.  
When his brothers saw Joseph, what did they call him?

A: *(A dreamer.)*

3. Q: What did they plan to do to Joseph?

A: *(They planned to kill him.)*

4. Q: Who stopped them from doing it?

A: *(Their eldest brother Reuben.)*

5. Q: What did the brothers do when Reuben was not present?

A: *(They sold Joseph to Ishmaelite businessmen as a slave.)*

6. Q: Where did these businessmen take Joseph?

A: *(To Egypt.)*

7. Q: Why did the Lord allow this to happen?

A: *(He needed Joseph in Egypt to help Him rescue Israel one day.)*

8. Q: The Bible says that if you love Jesus, God will make everything,  
that happens to you, work out for your .....?

A: **(Good.** *Facilitator to expand on this with examples and testimonies e.g.:*

- *As a Christian you should be patient. When you are normally impatient as a person, you may end up getting slow people in the queue in front of you, or when you drive as an adult, the cars in front of you may drive very slowly, and so on. You may then find it hard to stay patient, but it's **good** for you, for you'll learn to become patient.)*
- *As a Christian you should behave well when you're angry (control your anger). If you normally get angry easily, a lot of things may happen that will make you angry. You may then find it hard not to lose your temper, but it's **good** for*

*you, for you'll learn not to get angry so quickly and to control your anger.)*

9. Q: If you stay happy and smiling when hard things come your way because you love Jesus, what is waiting for you in heaven?

A: *(A prize or reward – facilitator to explain from Matthew 5:11-12: Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you:*

- *Because Satan rules the earth, God and His people are not really welcome on earth.*
- *You therefore will have a hard time from Satan and his people when you love and obey Jesus.*
- *If you don't mind this and still happily smile about it, the Lord will reward you one day in heaven with a prize.)*

**Memory verse:**

**Romans 8:28:** And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

### **31. Joseph Worked for Potiphar Questions**

Genesis 39, 2 Timothy 2:22, 1 Timothy 6:11, 1 John 1, Colossians 3:23

#### **Intended outcome**

- If you live righteous and do everything well, you'll have favour with God and man.
- Run away from sexual sin.
- Sin messes up your friendship with God and, if you live in sin, He cannot bless you as He would have liked to. Run away from it.
- Whatever you do, do it with all your heart as if for the Lord and not for men.
- Be careful of Satan and the sinful nature.

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

#### **Questions**

1. Q: Who did Joseph work for in Egypt?  
A: *(Potiphar, the captain of Pharaoh's guard.)*
2. Q: How did Joseph work?  
A: *(He worked hard, did good work, and the Lord blessed him.)*
3. Q: Who else did the Lord bless because of Joseph?  
A: *(Potiphar.)*

4. Q: Someone's wife had other plans with Joseph. Who was it?  
A: *(Potiphar's wife.)*
5. Q: What did she want to do with Joseph?  
A: *(Sleep with him and cause him to sin against God.)*
6. Q: Who do you think encouraged Potiphar's wife to tempt Joseph?  
A: *(Satan, who wanted Joseph to sin so he could lose God's blessings.)*
7. Q: Did Joseph sleep with her?  
A: *(No, he ran away.)*
8. Q: What should you do when temptation comes to you?  
A: *(Run away from it as fast as you can.)*
9. Q: Why should you run away from temptation?  
A: *(Sin messes up your friendship with God and makes you feel guilty, and if you live in sin, He cannot bless you as He would have liked to.)*

**Memory Verse:**

**2 Timothy 2:22:** Flee the evil desires of youth and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace. (NIV)

and/or

**1 John 1:9:** If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. (NIV)

## **32. God Needed Joseph in Prison Questions**

Genesis 40, Romans 8:28, Genesis 40, 1 Timothy 2:1-4, John 5:19-23,  
Psalm 23:4

### **Intended Outcome:**

- Your focus should not be on your circumstances, but on what the Lord plans for and through you and wants to accomplish in and through your life.
- Everything in life is about God's greater plan and we are often used by Him to accomplish this. It may not always be nice when it happens, but if we work along with Him, we will receive a wonderful reward.
- It's not all about you.
- Everything will in the end work out for the better for you.
- God will require of you to go through inconvenience for the sake of other people.
- God will require of you to be less comfortable in order to accomplish something in and through your life.
- In your circumstances, the Lord will always be there for you to support you.
- The Bible doesn't say that we won't have problems, but promises that God will help us get through it.

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

## Questions

1. Q: How do you think Joseph felt when he was innocently thrown into prison?

A: *(The answers are up to the individuals. Facilitator to prompt for answers.)*

2. Q: What has God arranged for Joseph to do in prison?

A: *(He had to look after the other prisoners.)*

3. Q: Was prison hard for Joseph?

A: *(No, he had a good life in prison.)*

4. Q: If you honour God, what does He do for you?

A: *(He looks after you. Facilitator to give and prompt for examples.)*

5. Q: What happened to the cupbearer because of his dream?

A: *(He got his job back.)*

6. Q: What did Joseph ask him to do?

A: *(To tell Pharaoh about Joseph.)*

7. Q: Did the cupbearer remember to do that?

A: *(No.)*

8. Q: According to the video, despite all the things that went wrong in Joseph's life, he could still see God's .....

A: *(God's goodness to him.)*

9. Q: Even if things go bad for you, how should you live?

A: *(In such a way that God's name are honoured by other people.)*

## Memory Verse:

**Psalm 23:4:** Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me, your rod and your staff, they comfort me. (NIV)

### 33. God made Joseph Ruler Questions

**Chant to be echoed before the video:** God's riches are not money, but are good things done for others.

Genesis 41:1-44, Galatians 5:22-23, Psalm 37:25

#### **Intended Outcome:**

- Joseph received all this power, fame, and riches because he humbled himself and submitted himself to God's will.
- God's riches are not money, but are good things done for others.
- We should be more interested in bearing the fruit the Lord expects of us, such as the fruit of the Spirit, than gathering material riches.
- Believing in Jesus makes you a child of the King of kings and you don't have to beg for anything. (Psalm 37:25)

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

#### **Questions**

1. Q: One night Pharaoh had two dreams. What did he do the next morning?

A: *(He called all his magicians to tell him what the dreams meant, but they couldn't.)*

2. Q: After Pharaoh had taken Joseph out of prison, he said Joseph had the power to make the meaning of dreams known. What did Joseph then say?

A: *(He said he had no power, but God has.)*

3. Q: The two dreams had the same meaning. What was the meaning of the fat cows and the beautiful heads of grain?

A: *(Seven good years with plenty of food.)*

4. Q: And the meaning of the thin cows eating the fat cows?

A: *(Seven years of famine, in other words no food in the land.)*

5. Q: Joseph then told Pharaoh he should put food away during the good years, so there will be enough food for the seven years of famine. This is not in the video, but what can we learn from it?

A: *(We should always put money away for the times when things don't go well. This is an opportunity for the facilitator to give brief advice on saving.)*

6. Q: If you believe in Jesus, what are you then? You are a...

A: *(Child of the King of kings. Therefore, you don't have to feel or act like a beggar or a tramp.)*

7. Q: Is God's riches money?

A: *(No.)*

8. Q: Name a few of God's riches?

A: *(Facilitator to draw it from the audience with help and promptings see Galatians 5:22-23 below.)*

### **Memory Verse:**

**Galatians 5:22-23:** But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. (NIV)

## 34. Plenty and Little Questions

Genesis 41:41-57, Matthew 6

### Intended Outcome:

- We should live in forgiveness, trusting the Lord to give us peace.
- Forgiveness should not only be words, but should be followed by deeds of love and blessing them.
- If you live in forgiveness, the Lord will bless you and give you peace. He will also work with you to restore relationships.
- God promised to meet all our needs, providing that we love both Him and other people.

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

### Questions

1. Q: Joseph was hurt because of what his family had done to him.  
What did he do about it?
  - a. Did he shout and hit things?
  - b. Did he sulk and get depressed?
  - c. Did he send a killer to sort them out?

A: *(He prayed for the Lord to comfort him and give him peace. He also did everything in a way the Lord liked it to be.)*

2. Q: When his sons were born, what did Joseph do to give God the glory?

A: *(He gave his sons names that show how good God was to him. Manasseh meant: "God has made me forget all my troubles",*

*and Ephraim meant: "God has made me fruitful in this land that made me so unhappy".)*

3. Q: What should you do if people hurt you? Facilitator to explain hurt, which is not only physical, but also emotional.

*A: (You should forgive them. Facilitator to explain what forgiving entails. Forgiveness also means blessing them and loving them with good things you do for them to the glory of God.)*

4. Q: If you do that, what will the Lord do for you?

*A: (He will bless you and give you peace. He will work with you to restore your relationship with the one you forgave.)*

5. Q: We know we shouldn't worry about our needs. Which two things do we need to do instead?

*A: (He wants us to love Him and take care of our relationship with Him. He also wants us to love people and care for them.)*

**Memory Verse:**

**Matthew 6:14-15:** For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins. (NIV)

### 35. Payback Time! Questions

Genesis 42, 43, and 44, Matthew 25:31-46

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: If you were Joseph and your brothers had treated you like that, would you have hated them and told them how bad they were?  
A: *(Hands up, who says YES you would have. Who says NO?)*
2. Q: When Joseph had told his brothers about his dreams many years before, they laughed at him and hated him for it. But the dreams came true when the brothers bought food from Joseph. How did it happen?  
A: *(His brothers bowed low before Joseph, not knowing it was him.)*
3. Q: Why did Joseph accuse them of being spies and put them in jail?  
A: *(They had to suffer a little because of the crime they did when they had sold Joseph and caused their father a lot of heartache.)*
4. Q: What did Joseph do to show God that he actually still love them?  
A: *(He gave their money back by putting it inside their bags of grain.)*
5. Q: We said in the video that we often do bad things to Jesus. What do you think we meant by that and how is it possible?  
A: *(a. Jesus told us in the Bible that when we hurt the people whom Jesus loves, or not look after them, we actually do it to Him. These are things like gossip, being nasty, being rude, being jealous, ignoring people's needs, not prepared to help people when you are asked to.  
b. When we keep on sinning, we make God's enemies laugh at*

*Him and mock Him – demons and people alike. "Look at him, he calls himself a Christian, but look what he does!"*)

6. Q: Will Jesus stop loving you when you struggle with temptation and sin.

A: *(No, he'd rather help you if you call for help.)*

This was one way of looking at why Joseph had his dreams and the way they came true. Next week we are going to have a look at a different reason for this.

**Memory verse:**

**Matthew 25:40:** 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

### 36. Joseph Reunited with his Family Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Joseph gave the brothers' money back at the goodness of his heart. Why were they scared when they found it?

A: *(They felt guilty because of what they did to Joseph, and thought this was a trap. They actually feared God's punishment.)*

2. Q: When you do something you know you shouldn't do, what do you usually feel?

A: *(Guilty and scared you may be caught out. You constantly look over your shoulder, in case someone will catch you out.)*

3. Q: If you keep on doing wrong things after you have been warned, what does God have to do?

A: *(He must discipline you. He makes all kinds of hard things happen to you so you can learn your lesson and stop doing the wrong things.)*

4. Q: Why were the brothers surprised that Joseph set the table according to their ages.

A: *(How could he know their ages? Explain a little.)*

5. Q: Why were the brothers scared when the soldiers found Joseph's cup in Benjamin's bag?

A: *(If their father Jacob would lose both his beloved sons it would break him. And it would be their entire fault because of what they did to Joseph. God planned it like this to teach them a lesson, but also to make sure Israel's family is cared for.)*

6. Q: What did the Lord tell Jacob when he heard Joseph was alive in Egypt?

A: *(He said He sent Joseph ahead to Egypt to prepare the way and that He will make Israel a big nation in Egypt.)*

7. Q: When you allow the Lord to direct your life, what will often happen?

A: *(All kinds of things that you don't understand why they happen. God is using these things to work out His plans with your life.)*

8. Q: When they happen, what should you not do and why not?

A: *(You shouldn't fear, for God knows what He's doing.)*

### **37. Moses Born Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Why did Moses' mother hide him?  
A: (Because Pharaoh had all the babies killed.)
2. Q: Why did Pharaoh have all the baby boys killed?  
A: (Because he was scared the Israelites will become too powerful in Egypt.)
3. Q: Why did Moses' mother put him in a basket and hide him between the reeds?  
A: (It became too difficult to hide him at home.)
4. Q: Who saw the basket and wanted him as her own?  
A: (It was Pharaoh's daughter, the princess. After his mother had nursed him, she took Moses and raised him as her own in the palace.)
5. Q: God had a clever plan with all this. What was His plan?  
A: (It was to save Israel from the slavery in Egypt.)
6. Q: God allowed all these things so he could get Moses to grow up near Pharaoh. This would help a lot later when the Lord used Moses to set Israel free. He always has a clever plan - explain. When you have a difficult problem, what should you do?  
A: (Ask our clever Lord to help you with it.)
7. Q: What must you then expect God will do?

A: (Surprise you.)

### **38. What does the Lord look for? Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: As Moses travelled Egypt, he saw the Israelites suffer. What did he wish he could do?

A: *(Help them. He probably thought of ways how he could help them, which is why he reacted when he saw the Egyptian beating an Israelite.)*

2. Q: After he killed the Egyptian, what did he try to do?

A: *(He tried to hide it.)*

3. Q: Was killing the Egyptian the way to solve the Israelites' problems?

A: *(No.)*

4. Q: What should he have done?

A: *(Prayed about it and waiting on the Lord to help.)*

5. Q: Somebody did cry to the Lord for help. Who was it?

A: *(The Israelites; and the Lord has heard their cry and listened.)*

6. Q: Who was the Lord's choice person to help rescue Israel from the Egyptian oppression?

A: *(Moses, because the Lord saw how much he cared for his people. The Lord also prepared the way for him by arranging for him to know the palace's workings. We will see in videos to come how the Lord has used the very Moses, who thought he could do it*

*himself, to deliver Israel.)*

7. Q: Put up your hands those who feel you are not good enough for God to use you. Did you know God will choose to use you? Do you know why?

A: *(Right throughout the Bible He has always used the people who didn't think of themselves as worthy to do something great. He won't use the bullies in life. He uses the humble and the meek to do great things, so His name can be glorified.)*

## **38A. Jesus' Christmas Gift List Questions**

### **Intended outcome**

- Giving to and serving others means you're doing it for Jesus.
- Using your talents is extremely important to the Lord.
- Obeying Jesus' commandments indicates your love for Him.
- Exhibiting faith accompanied by works is vital to the Lord.
- You may use the opportunity to bring the gospel from the point of view that Jesus first gave us eternal life in Him. These are things we can give to Him in return.

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

### **Questions**

1. Q: Heaven is fantastic, isn't it? DISCUSS A LITTLE. Imagine you live in this big house full of servants who do everything for you – give examples – warm bath, TV, toys, bicycle. Suddenly you are thrown out of this house and you have to live on the streets without a bed to sleep on, a TV to watch, toys to play with. Will it be nice? Do you think it was easy for Jesus to leave this fantastic and comfortable place and to live on this earth with all its problems?

2. Q: What was the earth like? Give examples.  
A: *(Sickness, violence [Roman Empire], war [soldiers], murder [murderers on cross], selfishness [rich young ruler].)*
3. Q: Whose birthday do we celebrate this time of the year?  
A: *(Jesus. Tell the truth about when He really was born (in September during the feast of tabernacles) and where the December date comes from.)*
4. Q: Tell me what you'd like for Christmas if your parents had all the money in the world.
5. Q: Tell me what you'd like to give to others if you had all the money in the world. To whom would you give it?
6. Q: What would you like to give to Jesus out of what you've learnt today?  
*(Options:*
- *Obedience to His commands,*
  - *Good works to other people,*
  - *Use of talents,*
  - *Really believe He exists and showing Him you trust Him.)*
7. Q. What is awaiting you in heaven if you give gifts to Jesus?  
A: *(A gift or a reward)*

### 39. Don't Make Excuses Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Why did the bush not burn up? Was it real fire? What was it then?

A: *(It was the glory of the Lord in the bush. God in all His glory was there right next to Moses.)*

2. Q: What did the Lord tell Moses to do when he got near the bush?

A: *(Not to come closer, but to take off his shoes for it was Holy Ground. This was because the Lord was right there.)*

3. Q: What did the Lord tell Moses His name was?

A: *(I am who I am, I am the Lord. This is why He was called The LORD throughout the Old Testament. Explain the difference between addressing Him by His being God and addressing Him by His name the Lord.)*

4. Q: Did Moses think well of himself?

A: *(No)*

5. Q: How do we know it?

A: *(He made excuses saying he was not good enough to do what the Lord told him to do.)*

6. Q: What did the Lord then tell him?

A: *(He said that He would be with Moses. He would help him.)*

7. Q: Why did the Lord get angry when Moses kept on thinking he was

not good enough to do what the Lord asked of him.

A: *(By thinking so Moses showed the Lord that he does not really trust Him to help him.)*

8. Q: What does the Bible say you can do through Jesus that gives you strength?

A: *(**All** things. There is nothing we cannot do if it is the Lord's will and He is with us to help us. Give examples of real men and women.)*

#### **40. You're Created with a Purpose Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What was it that Moses had to tell the Israelites?  
A: *a- That God wanted to deliver them from slavery.*  
*b- That God wanted to take them out of Egypt.*
2. Q: What was it that Moses had to tell Pharaoh?  
A: *Pharaoh had to let the people go worship God in the wilderness.*
3. Q: What three excuses did Moses make?  
A: *a- The Israelites won't believe me,*  
*b- they will not listen,*  
*c- I can't speak well.*
4. Q: Which signs did God give Moses?  
A: *a- Staff became a snake,*  
*b- His hand became leprous,*  
*c- The Nile's water will become blood if poured out.*
5. Q: What is it that made the Lord angry?  
A: *Excuses. But, still the Lord wanted Moses and no-one else to do it and arranged for Aaron to speak for him.*
6. Q: Did Moses believe in himself?  
A: *No*
7. Q: Did the Lord believe in Moses?

A: Yes

8. Q: What were Moses' talents?

A: *Leadership, faithfulness, ability to hear the Lord's voice.*

You were made for a special purpose.

There is something special only you can do.

Don't make excuses!

### **Memory Verse**

**Philippians 4:13:** I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.

## 41. God Does it Differently Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Moses told the leaders that God will rescue them. Did it give them hope?  
A: *(Yes.)*
2. Q: What did Moses tell Pharaoh?  
A: *(He must let the people go to worship God in the wilderness.)*
3. Q: What was Pharaoh's reaction?  
A: *(He gave orders to make the Israelites do double the work.)*
4. Q: Did the people blame Moses?  
A: *(Yes... it looked like things didn't work out well...)*
5. Q: Did Pharaoh realise who is the God of Israel?  
A: *(No, he only knew Egyptian idols, which were powerless.)*
6. Q: Do you think Moses expected a quick miracle?  
A: *(Yes... explain that God had another plan with Pharaoh to teach him a lesson - will learn more later.)*
7. Q: Who rules the earth ever since Adam had sinned?  
A: *(Satan.)*
8. Q: Who is called 'the father of all lies' in the Bible?  
A: *(Satan.)*

9. Q: Does he still lie to us?  
A: *(Yes, just like he had lied to Eve.)*
10. Q: What must I do when I feel everything is going wrong?  
A: *(-Distinguish lies from truth... fear steals faith,  
-Pray for guidance and wisdom,  
-Chase the devil away... fear steals faith,  
-Know the Lord has a plan, He sees the bigger picture.)*

## **42. With Jesus you Always Win Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What does the Lord want to do through you?  
A: He wants to work his power through you and wants to have people see Him in what you do.
2. Q: After Moses' staff became a snake, what happened to the magicians' staffs?  
A: They also became snakes.
3. Q: So how do we know that the Lord was still the most powerful?  
A: Moses' snake ate up all the other snakes.
4. Q: Who of you sometimes feel you keep on losing i.e. it feels as if nothing ever wants to come right? Wait for answers.  
But what are you when Jesus is with you?  
A: A winner - example.
5. Q: Why does the Lord sometimes wait a while before He helps you?  
A: He wants you to see what your faith is like - example.
6. Q: What does He then often show you?  
A: What He is like - example.
7. Q: When the Lord allows something bad to happen in your life, is it

good or bad for you?

A: Everything always works out good for you - examples

### **43. Don't Test the Living God Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Name the four plagues that we showed in the video.

A: (*Nile turned to blood,*

*Frogs,*

*Gnats,*

*Flies)*

2. Q: Why do you think the Lord had to send the plagues?

A: (- *Pharaoh had to learn a lesson.*

- *The Lord had to make him obey.*

- *Example of people using torture to get someone to do something.*

- *Maybe the Lord wanted to judge Egypt for what they have done to His people with the slavery.*

- *To show how powerful He is, because Moses told Pharaoh: "This will show you who the Lord is, He will remove all the frogs tomorrow.")*
3. Q: Many things that happen in our lives shows how great God is.  
Can you think of a few things?
- A: (- *The Lord providing rain out of season.*  
- *The Lord getting people to change or change their minds e.g. big leaders.*  
- *People getting healed.*  
- *People getting saved.*)
4. Q: Why do you think did Pharaoh not want the Israelites to go?
- A: (*Maybe he got too much free work and money out of them. And he felt powerful. Many times people do things we do not understand because they only think of themselves.*)
5. Q: Why do you think the video said Pharaoh tested the Lord?
- A: (- *We can say he tried to see how far he could push the Lord's patience.*  
- *He tried to see with how much he could get away before the Lord got angry.*)
6. Q: What is selfishness?
- A: (*It is when you only think about yourself and not care what you do to God and to others.*)
7. Q: How do we often test the Lord?
- A: (*We also try and see with how much sin we can get away before the Lord disciplines us. But be careful, the Lord is patient and gracious, but after you died you will be judged for all the wrong things you did and thought you'd get away with. If you are a Christian though, the Lord will regularly punish you, like parents do, so you can know not to do wrong things and try*

*your luck with Him.)*

#### **44. Do What the Lord Says Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Who can tell me which plagues we've discussed today?

A: *(Animals died  
Sores on the bodies  
Hail)*

2. Q: Did these plagues happen to the Israelites?

A: *(No)*

3. Q: Why would that be?

A: *(The Israelites were God's nation. He was their ruler/King. Pharaoh was king over the Egyptians. The Lord looks after His people, Israel. Pharaoh's decisions affected only the Egyptians – not the Israelites. Today Believers belong to their Father God and He looks after them. Unbelievers belong to their father the devil and he does to them what they ask him to do by what they say and do – facilitator to explain.)*

4. Q: Was God right in bringing the plagues over Egypt?

A: *(The Lord is the Almighty and He needs to do what is right. It was actually not him who brought the plagues over Egypt, but Pharaoh, for with every plague God gave Pharaoh a fair chance to obey Him and do as He asked, which Pharaoh chose not to do. If he had obeyed, the plagues would not have come. The same happens to you as well. You always have the opportunity to make the right decision to obey and then be blessed. Or to make the wrong decision and then have to bear the discipline your decision brings about.)*

5. Q: Where can you learn what the right thing is to do?

A: *(From the Bible)*

6. Q: What does it mean to fear God?

A: *(If you obey you have nothing to fear. But if you constantly keep on doing the wrong thing, the Lord will bring unpleasant things into your life to teach you to obey. It's like when you fear a hiding from your parents – facilitator to dramatise.)*

## **45. The Lord wants you to help Him Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Which two plagues did we discuss in the video?

*A: Grasshoppers & Darkness*

2. Q: Why did Moses say the animals must go as well?

*A: They needed animals to sacrifice to the Lord. This was very important to the Lord. Today we have to be living sacrifices to the Lord.*

3. Q: If you do not obey when the Lord wants you to do something, will He give up and say it does not have to be done anymore?

*A: No, He will get you to do it in the end.*

4. Q: What does the devil do to prevent you to help the Lord?

*A: He distracts you.*

5. Q: What else stops you from doing what God asks you to do?

*A: Your own selfish desires.*

6. Q: If you choose to ignore the devil and your own selfish desires and do what the Lord asks of you, what will you get?

*A: A reward.*

## Memory Verse:

**Ephesians 2:10:** For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

## 46. The Passover Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Say some Israelites didn't believe Moses and didn't put the blood on their doorposts, do you think their eldest child would die?  
A: *(Yes. If the Lord made a rule, it applies to everybody. God does not have favourites.)*
2. Q: What was the meal, consisting of the sacrificed lamb and bread without yeast, called?  
A: *(The Passover, and it is celebrated still today by Christians and Jews. It is called so because the angel of death passed over their houses and did not kill their firstborn.)*
3. Q: The Passover was to remind future Jews about something. What was it?  
A: *(The day that God delivered the Israelites from the slavery in Egypt.)*
4. Q: Jesus sacrificed Himself to deliver us from the slavery of sin. What do the Christians celebrate to remember this?

A: *(Communion. Facilitator to expand a little on communion.)*

5. Q: What is sin like?

A: *(It's like yeast. If you allow it in your life it grabs you and controls you so you don't do what you should do. Facilitator to expand on the entangling and controlling power of sin.)*

6. Q: What should you do when you're tempted to sin?

A: *(Run away from it.)*

7. Q: What should you do if you've sinned?

A: *(Pray and ask forgiveness for it. Jesus blood will protect you like the blood of the lamb protected the Israelites.)*

## 47. Trust the Lord in Tough Times Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Why did the Lord not take the Israelites along the normal route?

A: *(He knew that if they were attacked, some would turn back to Egypt.)*

2. Q: The Lord was present in a cloud during the day, which did two things for the Israelites. What were those 2 things?

A: *(a. He used the cloud to lead them – they only had to follow the cloud.*

*b. He made shade for them.)*

3. Q: What was the cloud like at night?

A: *(Like fire.)*

4. Q: What did that do for the Israelites?

A: *(It made light for them, so they could see where they were going.)*

5. Q: What does this tell us about the Lord?

A: *(He loves His people and cares for them.)*

6. Q: What does this characteristic of the Lord mean for you?

A: *(He is always near you and takes care of you, even if you don't see it.)*

7. Q: At the Red Sea the Lord did three things to protect the Israelites against the Egyptians. What were they?

A: *(a. He moved in between the Israelites and the Egyptians with the cloud so that the Egyptians were in the dark and the Israelites had light.*

*b. He opened the Red Sea for the Israelites to walk through, but caused the Egyptians to get confused, their chariots to get stuck in the sand, and let their wheels to come off.*

*c. He closed the Red Sea on top of the Egyptians so that they drowned.)*

8. Q: When you've prayed, but it looks like the Lord is not answering, what is actually happening?

A: *(The Lord is at work, even though you cannot see it. You just need to wait and keep on praying. That's faith. He will surprise you.)*

## 48. The Lord is an Awesome God

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: The Egyptians moved much faster than the Israelites. Why did they not get to the Israelites?

A: *(The Lord slowed them down by making their wheels fall off, causing their horses and chariots to sink into the sand, and by confusing them.)*

2. Q: What did the Egyptians then shout?

A: *(The God of these people is fighting against us. Let's turn around.)*

3. Q: When the Israelites saw how the Lord destroyed the Egyptian army they realised two things. What were they?

A: *(a. That the Lord is an awesome and powerful God who loved and saved them.*

*b. That Moses was the man God chose to lead them.)*

4. Q: What did the Israelites then do?

A: *(They sang and danced, praising the Lord.)*

5. Q: The Lord is always at your side. What does He do for you?

A: *(He loves you and cares for you.)*

6. Q: If we only look out for big miracles such as healing and miraculous answers to our prayers, what do we miss?

A: *(We miss the small ordinary miracles such as God's moment by moment protection and provision – facilitator to give examples.)*

7. Q: Since the Lord is looking after you and caring for your needs, what should you do?

8. A: *(You should care for and look after those the Lord loves – facilitator to give examples.)*

## 49. Love Tolerates Everything Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: The Israelites were very thirsty and got to some water. Were they able to drink that water?  
A: *(No, it was bitter.)*
2. Q: What did Moses have to do to get the water good again?  
A: *(Throw a piece of wood in the water.)*
3. Q: Do you think it was a miracle?  
A: *(Yes, just like all the other miracles the Lord had done for them.)*
4. Q: What did Moses then tell them.  
A: *(See how the Lord looks after you to keep you healthy.)*
5. Q: When they got hungry, did they look forward the next miracle God will do to help them?  
A: *(No, they complained again. After having seen so many miracles they still didn't trust the Lord to look after them.)*
6. Q: Do we always appreciate the good things the Lord does to help us?  
A: *(No, we see it all and have the promises in the Bible, but still*

*don't trust Him.)*

7. Q: Why did the Lord not punish them when they complained once again?

A: *(He is love and tolerates a lot of our nonsense. He simply gave them what they needed.)*

8. Q: At the end the video told us that because the Lord loves you He will do two things. What are they?

A: *(1. He will discipline you when you continue being disobedient and*

*2. He will always teach you how to love and obey Him.)*

9. Q: What do you think we need to do to learn to trust the Lord?

A: (We need to build a love relationship with the Lord so He could show us who He is and this way we will learn to trust Him John 14:21 – TESTIFY)

## 50. Food for Thought Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: When the Israelites got hungry in the desert what did they do?  
Did they ask the Lord for help?  
A: (No, they complained to Moses.)
2. Q: When Moses asked the Lord what He was going to do, what did the Lord answer him?  
A: (The quail and the bread. Notice that Moses had no doubt that the Lord was going to do a miracle. He didn't ask God whether He was going to do something. He asked Him what He was going to do. It is your and my choice whether we're going to rely on people or on the Lord.)
3. Q: When Moses returned to the people with the Lord's answer, what did he ask them? He said "Why are you...  
A: (...complaining to us? You are not ungrateful toward us, but toward the Lord.)
4. Q: Who did the Israelites rely on – God or people?  
A: (On people.)
5. Q: Can people really help you?

A: (No, they will probably let you down at some stage. People give up, get tired, make mistakes, have other things that become more important to them, etc. But the Lord is always faithful. He doesn't always jump when we flick out fingers, but many times He does (**dog example**). Sometimes He tests our persistence (**unfair judge**) by waiting before He answers and sometimes He has to delay because He has many things and people to get into place.)

6. Q: Why do you think some people kept manna for the next day?

A: (They did not really trust the Lord to keep His word and provide food for every day. Keeping manna was their saving plan in case the Lord did not provide.)

7. Q: Why did God let the manna go bad when the people stored some for the next day?

A: (He wanted people to trust in Him and not in their clever schemes.)

8. Q: What did the Lord tell the Israelites to do on the seventh day?

A: (They had to rest and give special attention to the Lord.)

9. Q: The Lord said we have no need to worry for He'll meet all our needs. What did He want us to do instead?

A: (All we need to do is to listen to God and obey Him.)

10. Q: What would YOU do? Are you going to trust the Lord to care for you, or are you going to worry about your needs all the time?

## 51. Honour the Lord as Holy Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: When the Israelites got thirsty again, have they learnt their lesson and asked the Lord to give them water?

A: *(No, they again demanded it from Moses.)*

2. Q: This was not in the video, but why did Moses get annoyed with them, asking them why they tested the Lord.

A: *(By then they have seen enough of God's power for them to have started to call on God themselves to meet their needs.)*

3. Q: Do you think the Lord wants you to rely on Him yourself or does He want you to always run to some other person, such as the pastor for help.

A: *(Paul told the Galatians they keep on being like babies who need milk, so much so that Paul was unable to feed them the meat of the Word – facilitator to explain.)*

4. Q: What did the Lord tell Moses to do with the rock the first time the Israelites needed water?

A: *(He had to strike the rock with his staff.)*

5. Q: And what did he have to do the second time?

A: *(Talk to the rock.)*

6. Q: Why do you think Moses hit the rock instead of speak to it as God had told him to.

A: *(I believe he did it because he was fed-up and instead of trusting the Lord, he reacted to his emotion of anger, like we would hit something when we're angry.)*

7. Q: Was the Lord happy when Moses did it?

A: *(No, he actually punished Moses severely. The Lord is much stricter than we think. He is patient with us and tolerates a lot, but if we keep on doing what we like and do not ask Him for His will, He will also punish us by making life difficult for us (give examples) until we realise that we cannot live as we'd like to.)*

8. Q: When we do things that does not honour God (examples like swearing, cheating, stealing, not respecting the opposite sex) what does the people and the evil spirits, who see us doing it, do?

A: *(They laugh at God – facilitator to give examples. Examples of evil spirits ridiculing God are found in:*

**2 Samuel 12:13-14:** *And Nathan said to David, "The LORD also has put away your sin; you shall not die. <sup>14</sup> However, because by this deed you have given great occasion to the enemies of the LORD to blaspheme, the child also who is born to you shall surely die."*

**Job 1: 6-10:** *Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan<sup>[b]</sup> also came among them. <sup>7</sup> And the LORD said to Satan, "From where do you come?"*

*So Satan answered the LORD and said, "From going to and fro on the earth, and from walking back and forth on it."*

*<sup>8</sup> Then the LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered My servant Job, that there is none like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man, one who fears God and shuns evil?"*

*<sup>9</sup> So Satan answered the LORD and said, "Does Job fear God for nothing?<sup>10</sup> Have You not made a hedge around him, around his household, and around all that he has on every side? You have blessed the work of his hands, and his possessions have increased in the land. <sup>11</sup> But now, stretch out Your hand and touch all that he has, and he will surely curse You to Your face!"*

## **52. Show the Lord you Trust Him Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What did the Amalekites do?  
A: (They attacked the Israelites from behind.)
2. Q: Did Israel have an organised army?  
A: (No, they just came out of slavery.)
3. Q: Who did Moses instruct to get together an army of good fighting men?  
A: (Joshua.)
4. Q: What happened while Moses kept his arms up?  
A: (The Israelites were winning.)
5. Q: When did they start losing?  
A: (When Moses let his arms down.)
6. Q: What did Aaron and Hur do when Moses was too tired to keep his arms up?  
A: (They held his arms up.)

7. Q: What should you do when someone you know is struggling?  
A: (You should help them – give examples.)
8. Q: Why did Moses not only pray, but had to keep his arms up?  
A: (The Lord wanted to see that Moses didn't get tired of trusting Him. Sometimes we work hard at doing things the Bible says we should do, but don't see results. The Lord then wants us to keep trusting Him – story of the train ticket.)
9. Q: The video said the Lord told us four things we should do. What are they?  
A: (1. Pray all the time.  
2. Ask and keep on asking.  
3. Ask His help in everything you do.  
4. Tell everybody that He has helped you.)

### **53. The Lord gave Instructions Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

Scripture passage to use as a chant in the beginning and the end:

**John 14:21:** Jesus said, "All who love me will do what I say. My Father will love them, and we will come and make our home with each of them."

1. Q: Did the Lord say that Israel is His treasure, a kingdom of priests, and a holy nation?

A: *(Yes. Facilitator to explain: To be holy means to be set to one side as special for the Lord. The Lord wanted the Israelites to know they are valuable to Him and that He especially chose them as His people to be different from the rest of the world.)*

2. Q: Why did the Lord decide to come down to where the people were?

A: *(He wanted people to hear Him speak so they so they*

*could believe and trust Moses. Facilitator to explain how God wanted to give Moses credibility. Please follow the guidance in point 3 of the facilitator's notes.)*

3. Q: What did the people have to do to prepare for the Lord's coming down to them?

A: *(They had to wash themselves and their clothes.*

*Facilitator to explain that in the Old Testament people had to clean themselves physically before they got into God's presence. Today we are spiritually clean because of Jesus sacrifice and the washing of His Word [John 15:3: You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you], but we still have to live clean lives by not doing wrong things, and if we do, we need to tell God we're sorry for our sins before we come into His presence.)*

4. Q: How did the people feel when the Lord came down in great power on the mountain?

A: *(They were trembling with fear, which means they were really scared.)*

5. Q: What should we be scared of when we keep on sinning?

A: *(If the audience do not have the answer ready, facilitator may prompt [see point 5 in facilitator's notes]: We should be scared of the Lord's discipline [punishment]. That should stop us from keeping on doing sin wilfully. He promised in the Bible [Hebrews 12:4-12] that, because He loves us, He will discipline us when we keep on being disobedient. Facilitator to explain that when our parents discipline us for doing something wrong, we will be scared of being disciplined again and will not want to do the wrong thing again. It works the same with the Lord.)*

6. Q: Why did the Lord give us rules to live by?  
A: *(The rules will protect us. If we obey the rules we will be safe and happy.)*
7. Q: Do you think gangsters and bad people are happy and safe?
8. A: (No)
9. Q: Why would you say that is?  
A: (Because they do not obey God's rules. Facilitator to explain: Because they are disobedient, they opened the door for devil to kill, steal and destroy and to mess them around. This is why they have no peace and happiness.)

### **Memory Verse**

**John 14:21:** Jesus said, "All who love me will do what I say. My Father will love them, and we will come and make our home with each of them."

## 54. God's Ten Biggest Rules Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Give me an example of other gods we can serve.  
A: (A sports star or car. Facilitator to give more examples.)
2. Q: What happens when you call the Lord's name?  
A: (He listens and if you then don't speak to Him, you make Him out to be a fool. Just like you feel stupid when someone calls you name and then don't speak to you. Facilitator to dramatise this.)
3. Q: You are to work for six days of the week. What must you do on the seventh day?  
A: *(You should rest and learn more about the Lord. As Christians we are free and it doesn't really matter on which day we rest and honour God, as long as we do it every seventh day. For those who can, it's best to join the other Christians on a Sunday. But if, say, you have to work on a Sunday, you can do it on another day.)*

*However, our real rest should be in Jesus. He became our rest day.)*

4. Q: What does God promise will happen if we respect our parents?

A: *(We will have a long and good life on earth.)*

5. Q: What does it mean to respect your parents?

A: *(Listen when they talk, spend time with them; ask their advice and, if it's good advice, do it; never talk badly about you parents to your friends – like using the term my old man.)*

6. Q: What did Jesus say do we actually do if we say something bad to or about a person?

A: *(We kill that person. Facilitator to expand on the power of criticism [actually pronouncing a curse] and gossip [I form an opinion of someone before I even met the person].)*

7. Q: What do we do if we look at pornography or sleep with a girl/boy when we are not married to them?

A: *(We commit adultery with them. Facilitator to explain the connection of becoming one.)*

8. Q: God told us not to steal. Tell me a few things we can steal.

A: *(Things like a pencil from school, someone else's ideas, another child's homework when you copy it, and when you look at someone else's answers when you write exams.)*

9. Q: When you tell lies about or to a person, what do you actually do?

A: *(Firstly you try to deceive them and make as if they are stupid. You also try to bring someone into trouble by lying about them. This is not love.)*

10. Q: Why is it wrong to desire someone else's things?

A: *(It messes up your relationship with that person and creates in you wrong attitudes. Even if you don't know the person it makes you bitter to e.g. other people groups or the rich or the capitalists – facilitator to explain where communism came from.)*

## **55. It's Easy to Worship Other gods Questions**

### **Intended outcome**

- To give the audience some guidance as to the power of peer pressure and what it can lead to.
- To make them aware of the importance of doing God's will instead.
- To make them aware of the bad effect idols will have on their relationship with the Lord and the importance of managing their time in a way as to include God in their lives.

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What did the Lord write on the two flat stones?  
A: *(His laws.)*
2. Q: What did some of the Israelites ask Aaron to do when Moses did not return to the camp for a long time? They wanted him to make them....

A: (...idols who could take them out of the desert. Facilitator to explain the reason why they wanted the idols and why Aaron gave it to them. You could use the possibilities below:

- The devil tempted them to disobey God's rules.
- Many people want to see action in-, and feel the excitement around religious activities. Faith, i.e. waiting on God, is too boring for them.
- Unlike Moses, who regularly met with God, Aaron was maybe like a churchgoer who just went through the motions and also wanted some excitement. It's also possible that he was under peer pressure and was tempted by Satan. He could even have regretted afterwards what he had done. Remember, real excitement is to see how God answers your prayers.
- It's possible that popularity with the people was more important to Aaron than obedience to the Lord.
- Facilitator to explain that to do the right thing is always harder than to submit to peer-pressure and do the wrong thing; following the crowd. If, however, you choose to do the right thing in spite of being unpopular, God will be pleased and He will protect and bless you.
- Facilitator can draw this through to children's daily life and the influence of peer pressure.)

3. Q: What did the Lord want to do with the Israelites when they worshiped the golden calf?

A: (He wanted to destroy them.)

4. Q: What did Moses then do?

5. A: (He convinced the Lord that to do such a thing would be bad for His reputation. To God our opinions are important and He does

*take them into consideration.)*

6. Q: There is something most of us do that comes easily. What is it?

A: *(We often serve and love idols. Facilitator can name a few idols e.g. a cell phone, friends, and watching television. **Being desperate to be part of the crowd in fear of being unpopular is also an idol.** When you do that, popularity with people is more important to you than being right with God.)*

7. Q: According to the video, what should we do?

A: *(We should love Jesus and obey the Father.)*

### **Memory verse:**

**Proverbs 1:10, 16:** My son (or daughter), if sinful men (or women) entice you, do not give in to them... for their feet rush into evil...

### **56. You are God's Temple Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: God told Moses to have a place built where God could live among His people. What was it called?

A: *(The Tabernacle.)*

2. Q: What was used to build the Tabernacle?

A: *(Only the best materials – gold, wood, cloth, bronze.)*

3. Q: Where did the materials that they used to build the Tabernacle come from?

A: *(The people gave the treasures they had received in Egypt to build the Tabernacle.)*

4. Q: Who helped the craftsman to do an excellent job? Somebody came

on them. Who was it?

A: *(The Holy Spirit.)*

5. Q: Who decided what everything should look like?

A: *(The Lord knew exactly what He wanted.)*

6. Q: What does this mean for you?

A: *(The Lord knows exactly what He wants in your life.)*

7. Q: Where does God the Holy Spirit live today?

A: *(In the hearts of the people who loves Him.)*

8. Q: What does it make your body?

A: *(A temple of the Holy Spirit.)*

9. Q: Should we build beautiful churches for the Lord?

A: *(No, we should make ourselves beautiful for Him.)*

10. Q: What must we do to be beautiful to the Lord? Should we make up our faces, wear nice clothes and lots of jewellery?

A: *(No, we should keep our **thoughts** and **what we look at pure**, and what we **do should be outstanding**.)*

11. Q: Who will help us with this?

A: *(The Holy Spirit. We should desire to change and work with Him.)*

### **Memory Verse:**

**Philippians 4:8:** Always think about what is true, and honourable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise.

## 57. Watch what you Say Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: The Bible says Moses was very\_\_\_\_\_. What was it?  
A: (*Humble. In fact he was the humblest man who ever lived.*)
2. Q: Miriam and Aaron did something to Moses. What was it?  
A: (*They criticised him.*)
3. Q: Did the Lord like it?  
A: (*No.*)
4. Q: What happened to Miriam as a result?  
A: (*She got leprosy.*)
5. Q: Did the Lord listen to Moses when he asked for her to be healed?

A: *(No.)*

6. Q: Why do you think He didn't? I mean He trusted Moses.

A: *(Miriam had to learn a lesson. To God criticising His anointed ones is a serious offense.)*

7. Q: What happens when we say bad things to other people?

ROLEPLAY

A: *(We hurt them and Satan uses the opportunity to make them feel bad about themselves.)*

8. Q: What happens if we gossip about people?

A: *(We make other people think badly of them and Satan causes them to become unwanted and unpopular.)*

9. Q: Once you've gossiped, can you take it back?

A: *(No. PASTOR AND FEATHERS STORY\*\*.)*

**\*\*The Story:** A woman gossiped badly about a pastor. He called her in, gave her several feathers and told her to place them in strategic places in town. When she returned, he sent her to go and collect them. "But, pastor," she said, "they will be blown away." He told her it is the same with gossip. You cannot take the words back, for the gossip will run and you have no control of how far it spread. The damage is done.

**Memory verse:**

Let's pray like David prayed:

Set a guard over my mouth, LORD; keep watch over the door of my lips. I will watch my ways and keep my tongue from sin.

## 58. Humble yourself Questions

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Did Moses grow up as an important man?

A: *(Yes, he was a prince?)*

2. Q: Is it easy to be humble when you are important?

A: *(No.)*

3. Q: Can you be important and humble?

A: *(Yes.)*

4. Q: How will you manage that? I mean you are so high!

A: *(You can choose to serve others and consider them more important than you. You can ask the Lord's help in everything you do and give Him praise for everything you do well.)*

5. Q: What did Moses become after he ran away to save his life?  
A: *(A shepherd.)*
6. Q: Was that an important person?  
A: *(No.)*
7. Q: Do you know what; even unimportant people can think a lot of themselves. What did the video say should you do to be humble?
8. A: *(Forget about yourself and trust the Lord to guide you. Realise that it's because of God's help that you're good, not because you are so good.)*
9. Q: How can you be humble towards others?  
A: *(By trusting them with what they're good at. To show them respect for that which they're better at than you are.)*

**Declaration:** What do you say when someone told you that you did something well? **I say:** "You did it very well."

**You say:** "Thank you, the Lord helped me."

**Memory verse:**

**James 4: 10:** Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will lift you up.

**Declaration before the video:** "Don't be scared, just do it." (*Note: Don't explain the declaration here. Once they've watched the video, they'll understand. REPEAT THE DECLARATION AFTER THE QUESTIONS.*)

### **59. The Lord said He will help you. Trust Him! Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: According to the video, what is very important to the Lord?  
A: (*He wants us to b..... in Him and t..... Him.*) [*Believe and trust*]
2. Q: How many men from each tribe were sent to spy the land?  
A: (One man. That makes it 12 spies.)
3. Q: What were the people in the land like? FIRST WAIT FOR AN

ANSWER... OTHERWISE PROMPT: Were they big or small?

A: *(They were big! Facilitator is to make a big thing of it.)*

4. Q: Were the cities and towns easy to attack?

A: *(No, they were well protected – facilitator to illustrate how it worked.)*

5. Q: Could one man carry the grapes that were collected?

A: *(No, they were so big that two men had to carry it.)*

6. Q: Did most spies think it would be easy to take the land?

A: *(No, ten of them were very scared and didn't trust the Lord. Facilitator is to emphasise their lack of faith and trust.)*

7. Q: What were the names of the two spies who trusted the Lord to help them take the land?

A: *(Joshua and Caleb. Forty years later they would become the leaders who took Israel into the Promised Land.)*

8. Q: According to the video, if the Lord asks you to do something, what will He give you with it?

9. A: *(The power to do it. You need to just obey and start doing it. As you start you'll receive the words, wisdom and strength to do what God asked of you. Expound and minister around this.)*

**Repeat the declaration:** "Don't be scared, just do it." *(Now you can explain if required.)*

**Memory verse:** *(In the case of a crowd such as at the school, let them chant the verse bit by bit after you a few times, like they do with the declaration.)*

**Psalm 37:5:** Commit everything you do to the LORD. Trust Him, and He will help you.

## **60. Go take What God Gave you Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Who did Moses say would lead the Israelites into the Canaan?  
A: (*The Lord.*)
2. Q: Would they just have walked in there and lived there, having a ball of a time? Dramatise.  
A: (*No.*)
3. Q: What did they then have to do?  
A: (*They had to defeat the people living there and drive them out of the land.*)
4. Q: When God has promised to give you something, what do you have to do?  
A: (*You have to take hold of it and do your part to get it.*)

*-E.g. God heard your prayer for His help to pass the exams and you know He would do it. Can you just go and write without studying?*

*-Or e.g. you must play a violin in a concert and you don't really have the courage to do it. After you've prayed you feel God promised He'll be with you. Will He lift you up and put you on the stage and play it for you? No, you have to trust Him and begin walking onto the stage and start playing. As you go He'll be with you.)*

5. Q: Who did Moses appoint to lead the people to conquer the land?

A: *(Joshua.)*

6. Q: Why did Moses have to go onto Mount Nebo?

A: *(The Lord wanted to show him the Promised Land.)*

7. Q: Why was Moses not allowed to enter Canaan?

A: *(When he sinned against the Lord when he hit the rock, God told him he would not enter Canaan.)*

8. Q: Why did the Lord not feel sorry for Him and changed His mind?

A: *(He always keeps His promises, whether good or bad - explain.)*

9. Q: What happened then?

A: *(Moses died and the Lord buried him.)*

10. Q: When you sin the Lord forgives you, but you still have to live with something. What is that?

A: *(The results/consequences of your sin - explain.)*

## **61. The Lord Prepares the Way Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Joshua was the new leader of the Israelites. What was he full of?  
A: *(The Spirit of Wisdom)*
2. Q: What did the Lord promise Joshua?  
A: *(-Every place you set foot on I will give you.  
-Nobody will be able to stand in your way.  
-I will never leave you or let you down.)*
3. Q: God told Joshua two things to do. What were they?  
A: *(-Be strong and show courage.)*

*-Obey God's law and think deeply about it.)*

4. Q: What did the Lord say will happen if he does it?

A: *(Then you will be successful in everything you do.)*

5. Q: What did Rahab do when the king sent for the spies to be arrested?

A: *(She hid the spies and deceived the soldiers.)*

6. Q: What did God give her in return?

A: *(She and her family were saved. What you sow you shall reap.)*

7. Q: Why were the people of Canaan scared of the Israelites?

A: *(They heard what the Lord had done for the Israelites – they were actually scared of what the Lord would do.)*

8. Q: We see the Lord had prepared the way for the Israelites. When the Lord wants you to do something, what will He do for you?

A: *(He'll also prepare the way for you. He will get everything ready for you. He will send people to help you get there and will give you everything you need to do it.)*

9. Q: What would stop you from getting where the Lord wants you to be?

A: *(Sin and not trusting the Lord – unbelief.)*

**Memory verse:** Mark 11:24: Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in my name, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.

## **62. Believe and see Gods Power Questions**

### **Intended outcome**

- Faith pleases the Lord.
  - You have to make the first move and God's power will follow.
  - Faith without putting action to it is useless.
1. Q: How was the priests' faith tested and God's name exalted (lifted high)?  
A: *(The priests had to carry the Ark of God into the raging river Jordan without stopping or doubting.)*
  2. Q: Was it easy to do?

A: *(No they were probably very scared.)*

3. Q: How was God's name exalted by their faith?

A: *(The moment their feet touched the water the river dried up at that point and they walked through on dry ground.)*

4. Q: Can you do anything successful without God's help?

A: *(No, Jesus said that without Him we can do nothing.)*

5. Q: Is it good enough to just believe without taking a courageous step to show your faith?

A: *(No. Such faith is dead. We need to start doing something to show we believe and then God will follow with His power.*

**Examples:** *Priests, Peter walking on water, Angus Buchan. Get examples and testimonies from audience.)*

6. Q: Putting action to faith has three steps. What are they?

A: *(1-Hear from the Lord what you need to do.*

*2-Believe God can do it along with you.*

*3-Just start doing it with the courage you got from the Lord.)*

7. Q:: Uncle Angus told of a time when he prayed for a woman to raise her from the dead - **GIVE BACKGROUND found here**  
<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RVQChXZB09k>. What steps did his faith follow?

A: *(1- He believed the Lord can do it, for he has told the people of this great God of his.*

*2- He then prayed and*

*3- He did what the Holy Spirit told him to do.)*

8. Q: Who of you would like to have that kind of faith?

### **Memory verse:**

**John 15:5:** "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." (NIV)

or

**James 2:20:** Do you want to be shown, you foolish person, that faith apart from works is useless? (ESV)

(If you wish, you may leave the phrase “you foolish person” out when teaching the verse to the audience.)

### **63. The Power of Obedience Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience’s level.

Show shofar and explain what it was used for.

Q: What did the Lord tell Joshua?

A: *(I HAVE delivered Jericho to you. No pleading or begging.)*

1. Q: If you pray what YOU want, do you always get what you’ve asked for?

A: *(No.)*

2. Q: There are three things you should do for effective prayer. What are they?

A: *(1-First hear from the Lord what He wants you to pray for.*

*2-Then pray what and how He wants you to pray.*

*3-Then do what He tells you to do.*

*4-Many times you have to wait.*

*5-Believe that you have received it. Start thanking the Lord by faith.*

*Then you'll receive what He wanted you to have.)*

3. Q: What is it again that you have to believe then?

A: *(That He **has** given it to you. You already have the ticket. Just wait for the movie.)*

4. Q: Sometimes when the Lord tells you to do something, others may think it's foolish. Even you may think so. What should you do?

A: *(Keep on doing it.)*

5. Q: If you keep doing it, what will come next?

A: *(God's miracle.)*

6. Q: Why did they have to destroy the whole city and all the people?

A: *(Because the people would have led them to serve other gods.)*

7. Q: What should we do with things that keep you from serving the Lord?

A: *(Get rid of them. Stress the seriousness of this. Explain examples of **what, and how** to get rid of them.)*

**Memory verse:** 2 Corinthians 7:1: So then, let us purify ourselves from everything that makes body or soul unclean, and let us be completely holy by living in awe of God.

## **64. Don't Steal from the Lord Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Why did they think it was going to be easy to conquer Ai?  
A: (*Ai was a small city.*)
2. Q: Why did they lose the battle against this small city?  
A: (*God did not help them because some of them were disobedient.*)
3. Q: What is it the disobedient person has done?

A: *(He took something that the Lord said belonged to Him.)*

4. Q: We also sometimes steal from the Lord. How do we do it?

A: *(We don't give to the Lord what belongs to Him.)*

5. Q: Who knows what it is we need to give to the Lord?

A: *(You need to give the Lord a part of everything you receive.*

*Ten percent is a good standard to go by, but the **more we give the more we receive**. It also doesn't only have to be money. We can give away **help, love, friendship, care, a smile, our time**... The Lord said: "Whatever you have given to others, you have given to Me.")*

6. Q: Who would love to steal from us if God's protection is away because we don't give to the Lord?

A: *(The devil. Give examples of how he steals from us.)*

7. Q: What will God do if we are faithful in giving?

A: *(He will pour out His blessings on us. Give examples.)*

8. Q: Three things happen when you choose to live in sin. What are they?

A: *(1- You miss out on God's blessings.*

*2- Your family also suffers, and*

*3- You don't live in victory - explain.)*

## **65. Do it God's Way and Win! Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What did the Lord promise Joshua He would do as long as Joshua pointed his spear towards Ai?  
A: *(He would give Ai into Israel's hands.)*
2. Q: Every army has a strategy for each battle and this needs

to be planned beforehand. Who planned the attack on Ai?

A: (*The Lord.*)

3. Q: Why did the king of Ai attack the Israelites without proper planning, leaving Ai undefended?

A: (**a-** *The previous time it was easy to conquer and he thought it was going to be easy again.*

**b-** *However, since the Lord told Joshua He will give Ai in his hands, it's possible that the Lord made the king blind to the fact that he was leaving Ai undefended.*

**c-** *The Lord had probably also planned this whole attack in detail beforehand. He allowed the fact that Israel lost the previous time and the king's resulting arrogance to deceive the king into believing it would happen again. Facilitator to explain.)*

4. Q: Our lives are a constant battle. We fight our competition in performance, sports, jobs, and business; we fight illness, poverty, sin, demonic attacks, etc. Who is it that can see from the outside things we cannot see?

A: (*The Lord.*)

5. Q: Who is it that knows the best strategy to overcome every situation?

A: (*The Lord.*)

6. Q: You have a choice.

- a. You can think ***you*** have worked out a good plan and feel good about it, boasting to others about it, or
- b. You can ask the Lord's help to give you a good strategy and then give Him the glory for helping you.

Which of these do you think is the best?

A: *(Giving God the glory and thank Him. If you do that, He will help you even quicker the next time.)*

7. Q: After you've asked the Lord what strategy to use, or for Him to help you, will it always happen immediately?

A: *(No.)*

8. Q: What should you then do?

9. A: *(**Wait** on the Lord for the answer or strategy.)*

## **66. Watch out for Cheaters**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What did the Gibeonites do?

A: *(They cheated/deceived the Israelites.)*

2. Q: Do you think the Gibeonites were honest?

A: *(No, everything they did was a lie.)*

3. Q: Do you think there are still such cheaters and liars today?

A: *(Yes, lots.)*

4. Q: Why were Joshua and his leaders easily deceived?

A: *(They looked at what they could see and hear, i.e. their own skills, and did not ask the Lord's advice.)*

5. *Tell the story of what came after that – the fact that the Gibeonites became their slaves. You will always bear the consequences.*

6. Q: There will always be people that will try and cheat you. Who can help you to see the people for who they are?

A: *(The Lord.)*

7. Q: Why would the Lord make a difference?

8. A: *(Because He can see what we can't see and knows what we don't know.)*

9. Q: When you ask the Lord to help you, He will give you two things. What are they?

A: *(a- A Word of Knowledge. You'll just know what to do.  
b- Peace about it. You won't be anxious.)*

So wait until you feel peaceful about it before you make a move.

## **67. Complete God's Instructions Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What deal did the Gibeonites have with Israel?

A: *(They would serve Israel and Israel would protect them.)*

2. Q: Who didn't like this deal?

A: *(The kings of the cities around Gibeon.)*

3. Q: Israel made a mistake by making a deal with Gibeon. They actually should have destroyed them. Did God refuse to help them because of this?

A: *(No, the Lord understands our weaknesses and as long as we repent and call for His help, He'll help us out - even out of the trouble we got into because of mistakes we've made.)*

4. Q: How do you know the Lord is prepared to help you?

A: *(He promised it many times in the Bible.)*

5. Q: When you're in trouble, you should ask the Lord for two things in prayer? What are they?

A: *(a- To show you what you should do to get out of it.  
b- Ask Him to fight on your behalf.)*

6. Q: What would the Lord then give you?

A: *(He'll give you Bible verses that will give you faith.)*

7. Q: What must you do with those Bible verses?

A: *(You must repeat them in prayer until the Lord gives you victory.)*

## **Memory Verse**

Psalm 91:14: "Because he loves me," says the LORD, "I will rescue him; I will protect him, for he knows my name."

## **68. God Built His Nation Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Who did God tell to start travelling and He will tell him where to go?

A: (*Abraham.*)

2. Q: Who was Abraham's son for whom he waited a long time?  
A: (*Isaac.*)
3. Q: Who was it that cheated his dad and brother?  
A: (*Jacob.*)
4. Q: What was Jacobs' new name?  
A: (*Israel.*)
5. Q: Who was Jacob's favourite son whom he spoiled?  
A: (*Joseph.*)
6. Q: Who led the Israelites out of slavery to the Promised Land?  
A: (*Moses.*)
7. Q: Who lead the Israelites into the Promised Land?  
A: (*Joshua.*)
8. Q: All of us were or still are in our own Egypt. We are slaves to something? What is it we are slaves to?  
A: (*Sin. Facilitator needs to explain how it works. Normally when we are caught up in sin it dictates our behaviour and we find it hard to get rid of it.*)
  
9. Q: The video mentioned that there are three enemies in our lives. They keep us away from a life of fulfilment together with the Lord. What are they?  
A: (*Sin, selfishness and Satan.*)

**Memory verse:**

**Romans 8:37:** In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

## **69. To Love is to do Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What happened to the man who went on the journey?  
A: (He was attacked by robbers and left for dead.)

2. Q: Do you think he needed help?

A: (Yes.)

3. Q: First a priest/pastor/bishop came upon him and after that a Levite came, someone who helped out in the church, such as an elder. Do you think a priest or a pastor is a good person?

A: ANSWER

4. Q: Why would you say so?

A: (Discuss answer with audience.)

5. Q: Do you think an elder or deacon is a good person?

A: ANSWER

6. Q: Why would you say so?

A: (Discuss answer with audience.)

7. Q: Did the Jews and Samaritans like one another?

A: (No.)

8. Q: Do you think they always knew the individuals they didn't like?

A: (Discuss the fact that often races hate one another, but they don't really know why. It's often a small group that causes all the trouble **from both sides**. Individuals don't usually have a problem with one another.)

9. Q: According to this parable story, what would you say a neighbour to you is?

A: (It's someone who cares for you and would go to trouble to help you.)

10. Q: What would you have to do to be a neighbour to someone else?

A: (Go to trouble to help them when they are in need.)

## **70. Put God's Kingdom First Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Who of you would have liked to find a treasure? Discuss what they would have wanted to be in it.
2. Q: When Jamie had found the treasure, why could he not just take it?

- A: (The field did not belong to him.)
3. Q: Did he have enough money to buy the field?  
A: (No.)
4. Q: When they had to sell everything they had, has it been easy for them. Did they want to sell everything?  
A: (No.)
5. Q: Who did not want to sell some of their things?  
A: (Jared and Jamie's wife.)
6. Q: What did they get in return?  
A: (Much more than they had before.)
7. Q: What should you do to get more of Jesus and be rich in another way?  
A: (You should give up the things that you think are important and that make you rich. Having Jesus and everything He is makes you RICH.)
8. Q: Why did Jesus give up everything He had?  
A: (So you can be free from sin.)
9. Q: Who says having Jesus on your side will make life much easier?
10. Q: Who says we only need Him two hours a day. The rest of the time we can do without him?
11. Q: Who says we can have Jesus on one side and do wrong things and sin on the other? I.e. live like we wish and use Jesus only when we need him.
12. Q: What is it then that we must get rid of so Jesus can take our entire life?  
A: (Everything that Jesus doesn't like us to have.)

## **71. Do you Love the Bible Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What did Jesus compare the seeds to?

A: *(The Word of God or the Bible. The Word of God is compared to seed because it's living and active and is meant to change us and*

*let us bear fruit.)*

2. Q: Where did Willy, the first seed, fall.

A: *(On the road.)*

3. Q: The road is like people's hard hearts. What happens to the seed of God's Word if it falls on a hard heart?

A: *(The devil steals it and it can't bear fruit. A hard heart is someone who resists God's Word, who doesn't want to hear about God. So when they hear the Word of God, they close their ears and minds to it, and the devil takes these wonderful truths away just in case the Word changes their mind.)*

4. Q: What happened to Hilly, the second seed?

A: *(It fell on a rocky place where it could not get enough water. Its plant then died.)*

5. Q: Jesus said this happens when people accept the Word with joy, but when trouble comes, they stop believing in the Bible and the Lord. Why would you think that is?

A: *(Some people only believe in God when it goes well with them. They have only given part of their lives to the Lord. When things start going bad, they blame the Lord for it and turn away from Him.)*

6. Q: What did Elly see when she pushed her little plant above the soil?

A: *(Ugly big weeds and thorn bushes.)*

7. Q: What did these weeds and thorn bushes do to her?

A: *(They smothered and killed her.)*

8. Q: Jesus said that these are earthly worries and material things that kill the Word of God in some people's hearts. Why would that be?

A: *(These things so take over the minds of some people that there is no place for God's Word. On Sunday they hear the Word of God*

*and get very excited about what they've learnt. But when the worries of the week starts coming in and they watch their TV programs and do all the other worldly things, they forget the Word of God, instead of using it to make them strong.)*

9. Q: Tilly landed on good soil. What did she make in the end?

A: *(Many more seeds like herself. She bore much fruit.)*

10. Q: What did Jesus mean by this?

A: *(If there is nothing in our lives to steal the Word of God away from us, those who really want God's Word will receive it with joy, will live like it tells them to live, and will have lives full of God's fruit.)*

## **72. Where is your Treasure? Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: What did the two brothers argue about?

A: *(Money.)*

2. Q: When the farmer had a lot of wheat to live from (it's the same as money and things). What did he say?

A: *(He said he has enough to live from. This made him happy. He can now take it easy.)*

3. Q: What did the Lord then tell him?

A: *(He said the farmer was stupid, because when he died he would have nothing.)*

4. Q: Where did Jesus say our treasure (our riches) should **NOT** be?

A: *(Here on earth.)*

5. Q: Where should it then be?

A: *(In heaven.)*

6. Q: When we love money, power, and things, does it take our attention away from God?

A: *(Yes. It's because we have to give so much attention to it that we have no time for the Lord. **Matthew 6:24**: "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.")*

7. Q: What is it that the Lord would love to have around Him in heaven?

A: *(People. They are His treasure.)*

8. Q: If God loves people around Him in heaven, what must we do to have a treasure in heaven?

A: *(We must tell people about Jesus so they could go to heaven to be with the Lord.)*

9. Q: The video said we can do three things to show people the Lord loves them. What are they?

A: *(1- Do good things for them in Jesus' name.  
2- Tell them about Jesus and His love for them.)*

*3- Teach believers who God is and how to have faith.)*

### **73. Bring in the Harvest Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Jesus said that He was the way the truth and the life. What would you say is a way?

A: *(A road leading somewhere – give an example of the road to the beach. Jesus is the way to get to Father God and to heaven.)*

2. Q: Who of you know the way to the beach?

3. Q: How did you get to know it?

A: (Possibly because someone showed you the way.)

4. Q: Who of you have discovered the way to something nice, like a shop that sell sweets, or nice food?

5. Q: Was it nice to have discovered it?

6. Q: Did you feel like you'd want to show it to your friends – showing them the way?

7. Q: Who of you have discovered how lovely Jesus is?

8. Q: Did someone show you the way to Jesus? Are you glad about it?

9. Q: Who of you have showed a friend the way to Jesus?

10. Q: Who would like to show a friend the way to Jesus?

## **74. Heaven Celebrates when you come Home Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Do you know what a shepherd is?

2. Q: How many sheep did the shepherd have?

A: 100

3. Q: What happened to the one sheep?

A: *He got lost.*

4. Q: What did the shepherd do? Did he worry about him? I mean he still had 99 other sheep.

A: *He left the 99 and went to look for the lost sheep UNTIL he found it.*

5. Q: What did his friends do when he told them he had found his sheep?

A: *They celebrated with him.*

6. Q: When the lady lost her silver coin, what did she do?

A: *She searched for it everywhere!*

7. Q: Did she give up when she couldn't find it?

A: *No, she kept on searching until she found it.*

8. Q: What did her friends do when she told them she had found her coin?

A: *They celebrated with her.*

9. Q: When you go away from Jesus, does he say: "Oh well, he or she wanted to leave me, so I don't care"?

A: *No, he keeps calling you until you return to Him.*

10. Q: When you hear Him call your name, what should you do?

A: *Run to Him saying: "Here I am Jesus. I want to be with you."*

11. Q: When this happens, who celebrates then?

A: *All the angels in heaven.*

## **75. Which son was the Lost One? Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: When the youngest son asked for the money he was to inherit one day, did the father give it to him?

A: Yes.

2. Q: What did he do with it?

A: *He wasted it on drinking and partying?*

3. Q: What happened to him after all his money was gone?

A: *His friends left him and he had nothing left. He was so hungry he wanted to eat the food of the pigs he was caring for.*

4. Q: He decided to go back to his father and tell him he was only good enough to be a servant to his dad. Was his dad angry because his son wasted his money?

A: *No, he was very happy to see son again and prepared a feast (celebration) for him.*

5. Q: What did the father say about the son?

A: *He said he was lost and was found; he was dead but was alive again. Explain.*

6. Q: Who was angry because his father gave the younger son a celebration?

A: *The older son.*

7. Q: What was the only thing the father really wanted?

A: *He wanted both his sons very near his heart. He wanted a good relationship with both.*

8. Q: Did either of the sons have this relationship with their father?

A: *No, both sons only thought of themselves and their own happiness.*

9. Q: Who of the two then was the lost son.

A: *Both, for their hearts were far away from the father.*

10. Q: What is it God the Father wants from you?

A: *He wants you to be close to his heart, not only thinking of your*

*own interests, but His.*

## **76. God trusts you! Be faithful. Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

A talent in Jesus' time was a measure of, for example, money. Like this represents twenty rand (show the note), a talent of gold or silver was a certain amount that could buy certain things.

From that parable in the Bible the word talent is widely used for a specific ability – something that comes naturally and something you will do with enthusiasm.

List me a number of talents.

Also doing business

Making money

Show forks movie

1. Q: What happened when the man with the five talents put his talents to work?

*A: His talents became more.*

2. Q: This parable speaks of money. Normally if you work clever with money, it becomes more and you become rich. Money makes money it is said. But if you put a talent to work, it can also become more. How would that be? Let's take writing songs as an example.

*A: Explain how you will write lots of songs and will get new and unique ideas, etc. Use the forks example – more ideas what to use forks for.*

3. Q: What did the man who received the one talent do with his talent?

*A: He buried it.*

4. Q: What did he tell the master his reason was for doing it?

A: *He said he was scared because he knew the master was a hard man. Explain that many people don't use their talents because of fear of failure, or people laughing at them, or the standard set by others – in fact most people don't use their talents because of time stealers such as e.g. TV, cell phones etc. Like Jesus said in the story, God will judge you for not using your talents.*

5. Q: What did the master call the man who buried his talent?

A: *You lazy, wicked servant.*

6. Q: Why do you think the Lord is so strict about us having to use our talents?

A: *We really have no excuse for not using our talents because:*

a- *The talent in itself gives us everything we need to make it work. It gives us the ability – we just need to add willingness and hard work.*

b- *The Lord is there with us to help us. In fact, the talent in itself is His anointing working through you in that area – give examples.*

*This is why the master called the servant lazy and wicked. He was lazy to put work into making his talent work. His not trusting his ability and the Lord's anointing is actually wicked, yielding to Satan's temptation.*

7. Q: What happened to him?

8. A: *He lost what had been given to him and he lost his relationship with his master and his fellow servants. He was thrown out in the dark where there were bad things – explain weeping and gnashing of teeth. Pull it through to hell as described in the Bible.*

9. Q: How about you.

a- Are you too lazy to use your talents?

b- Are you feeling self-conscious about using your talent?

c- Are you allowing people to criticize your talent?

d- Are you giving up too soon?

## **77. The Two Builders Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

1. Q: Why did Mike build his house on the sand?

A: *It was too much work to dig foundations in the hard ground. Do you know what a foundation is?*

2. Q: Why did Charles build his house on the rock?

A: *Because he wanted it to be strong.*

3. Q: What happened to Mike's house when the water washed around the houses?

A: *The water washed away the sand underneath the house and it crashed down.*

4. Q: Did the same happen to Charles' house?

A: *No.*

5. Q: What does the Bible call the name of the Lord?

A: *A strong tower into which believers can run and be safe.*

6. Q: Who is the rock on whom we must build our life?

A: *Jesus and His Word, the Bible.*

7. Q: What can happen if you listen to wrong ideas and do not build your life on the rock Jesus and His Word?

A: *Your life can crash down because you have nothing strong to hold onto.*

8. Q: And what will you have if you **do** build your life on the Rock Jesus and the Word?

A: *You will something strong to hold onto and you will have hope.*

9. Q: What two things must you do to build your life on the Rock and as a result have something strong to hold onto?

A: *You should study the Bible and get to know Jesus through much prayer.*

## **78. Do you Forgive Others? Questions**

**Facilitator, please remember NOT to read these questions to the audience.** They are written at your level as a guide. You ought to ask them in your own words at the audience's level.

Before you start with the questions ask: Will Jesus always forgive you?

## Questions

1. Q: How many times must I forgive?

A: *Seventy times seven. Explain that you actually don't stop forgiving.*

2. Q: Did the worker beg for mercy?

A: *Yes*

3. Q: What did the king say?

A: *I forgive you everything. You don't have to pay me anything back.*

4. Q: How did the man treat the person who owed him only a little?

A: *He put him in jail until he paid everything he owed him.*

5. Q: Was it right?

A: *No.*

6. Q: Who should we forgive?

A: *Let audience make a list. Prompt and help them. Parents, friends, teachers, government...)*

7. Q: Do you and I also do sin?

A: *Yes*

8. Q: Does Jesus forgive us?

A: *Yes, every time*

9. Q: The Bible says we must forgive from our hearts, not only with words. How do we do that?

A: *We bless the person and show them special kindness and love.*

In the "Our Father" prayer Jesus taught us to pray: "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sinned against us. So if we don't forgive, God will not forgive us.

**Memory verse:**

Matthew 6:14-15: <sup>14</sup> For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. <sup>15</sup> But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.
